I have to share a wonderful mailing I received the other day that typifies the generosity of animal lovers. You may recall the story of Delko from last spring. Delko, an older, big German so much pain. He had pretty much lost all hope and desire to go on. With lots of loving care and patience from shelter staff and volunteers, he eventually gained strength and the will power to get moving again; he started enjoying his walks and new friends. A couple from Luther, Michigan saw his picture and description on Pet Finder and drove to Macomb with their mature GSD girl to adopt him. They have kept in touch about his progress and life on the farm. Their most recent correspondence was a letter of thanks for having Delko in their lives, with a \$1,000 check enclosed to support the New Animal Shelter Campaign. As I said about them once before, "Angels do walk among us."

And talk about generosity and the uplifting of our spirits. We have over \$900,000 raised for the new animal shelter and are at a point where we are honing in on how much it will actually take to build the new facility and where it will be located.

We have spent the last year exploring options for renovation and have pretty much concluded that a new structure is the most cost efficient avenue to take. We are determined to use whatever resources we can locally to keep the costs under control while still having a shelter of which we can be proud; one that will be durable and serve the needs of animals and the people in our county.

Casino Night on March 1st will be our next major fundraiser for the new animal shelter. We raised \$100,000 with the first two Casino Nights, held in 2023 and 2024; we are hoping for another very successful event this year. Attendees will enjoy the same outstanding venue and casino equipment as in previous year, with lots of fun to be had. So mark your calendars and be ready to "play."

We're highlighting a few of the "happy every after" adoption stories of shelter animals who so needed a home that came with loving attention and patience. This year's very successful Brix Challenge is a big part of how we support these needy animals and we are so grateful to Chris Brix and those who respond to his challenge. Foster parents, volunteers and, of course, the shelter staff all contribute to happy outcomes. And we can't forget Pet Supplies Plus where cats are showcased and end up finding homes. My new kitty Ziggy Stardust (aka Stripe) spent time there.








Record breaking results

For eleven years Chris Brix has challenged others to join him in raising funds during the month of October for the HSMC annual operating costs. Each challenge has been met with enormous support and this year's Brix Challenge saw record-breaking results, raising over \$37,800. That is amazing, exciting and heartwarming and means great things for many animals in need in McDonough County. All of the funds raised will be used directly to help homeless and needy animals. These dollars fund the ongoing services and programs provided to provide specialized medical care to shelter animals, promote the shelter cats and dogs, and assist pet owners in emergency situations via the Angel Fund as well as through the Pet Food Pantry.

Our regional media venues helped us reach a large number of people again this year. With their support, that of members and friends, local businesses, mailings, social media and word of mouth Chris Brix's challenge was met with enthusiasm that started early and continued throughout. One generous couple chose to donate their Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from their IRA to the Brix Challenge, something others may decide to do in the future, as well. We are extremely grateful to everyone who participated in any way. It's difficult to express how much that kindness is appreciated or to explain the positive effect it will directly have on the animals whose lives it will touch.

Our most sincere thanks to everyone who participated in Brix Challenge 2024 for your gracious support, for caring about the welfare of our community's animals, and for your confidence in and partnership with the HSMC.
